

Jeffrey B. Lindeman Memorial Research Award AND HNS Cultural Diversity Research Award For Students, Interns, and Post-doctoral Fellows

CALL FOR POSTERS!

The Houston Neuropsychological Society (HNS) would like to invite students, interns, and post-doctoral fellows to submit an abstract for virtual presentation at the October 24, 2020 fall symposium. Deadline for RECEIPT of submissions is **Saturday, October 17, 2020**.

Posters must be available for viewing during the 2020 HNS symposium. As this year's symposium will be virtual, each presenter will be assigned a breakout room, where they can individually share their work during the symposium. Authors must submit a one-page PDF copy of their poster to be distributed to the symposium audience and be available to answer questions on their work.

During the symposium, two top-rated submissions will be awarded a prize of \$100 each, with one of the awards going to the poster that best contributes to the topic of culture and diversity in neuropsychology. All posters submitted will automatically be considered for BOTH categories, though no poster can win both prizes.

Registration Fees:

- Non-members: \$60
- Members (full): \$50
- Student/trainee/retired members: \$15
- All trainees with poster submission: **FREE**

The Program Committee will review all abstracts, and their decision is final. We welcome new research, or work that may have been presented previously at a scientific conference within the past year.

PLEASE NOTE: Submission of a poster implies registration and attendance at the conference, and presentation of the work. The program committee will review all abstracts, and their decision is final. We welcome new research, or work that may have been presented previously at a scientific conference, as long as the student is the first author.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMISSION FORM

Identifying information: Complete all information of the author including first and last name, degree (BA, BS, MA, PhD, PsyD, etc.), as well as the site at which the presented data was obtained.

Award Consideration: Please indicate if the author is a graduate student, intern, or post-doctoral fellow. The authors of the two top-rated submissions will be awarded a prize of \$100 each, with one of the awards going to the poster that best contributes to the topic of culture and diversity in neuropsychology. Of note, if you are a trainee and you submit a poster, then your attendance at the Symposium is **FREE**.

Title and Text: Include a 250 word abstract in the box provided. Please **OMIT** authors from the text box, but include the complete title of the submission. Use 12 point font and single line spacing.

If you wish to submit a poster*, please register online (use coupon code “poster2020”) and send your completed abstract submission form to Dr. Michael Williams, MWwilliams2@uh.edu, by 10/17/2020. The subject line should state, “**HNS Symposium Research Award.**”

*The actual poster should be submitted in PowerPoint format, along with a one-page PDF copy of the poster for distribution to the audience. The poster and PDF copy are due to Dr. Williams by 10/23/2020 at 5:00 PM CDT.
