CALL FOR POSTERS!

The Houston Neuropsychological Society (HNS) would like to invite students, interns, and post-doctoral fellows to submit an abstract for presentation at the HNS Fall Symposium on Saturday, October 22nd, 2022. **Deadline for RECEIPT of submissions is Friday, October 14, 2022.** If you are a trainee and you submit a poster for presentation, then your attendance at the symposium is **FREE**.

Posters must be available for viewing during the 2022 HNS Fall Symposium. Set-up will begin at 8:30am. Authors must be available to answer questions on their work during the breakfast period (8:30am to 9:00am) and mid-morning break (10:20am to 10:45am).

During the symposium, two top-rated submissions will be awarded a prize of \$100 each, with one of the awards going to the poster that best contributes to the topic of culture and diversity in neuropsychology. All posters submitted will automatically be considered for BOTH categories, though no poster can win both prizes.

The Program Committee will review all abstracts, and their decision is final. We welcome new research, or work that may have been presented previously at a scientific conference within the past year.

PLEASE NOTE: Submission of a poster implies registration and attendance at the conference, and presentation of the work. The program committee will review all abstracts, and their decision is final. We welcome new research, or work that may have been presented previously at a scientific conference, as long as the student is the first author.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMISSION FORM

Identifying information: Complete all information of the author, including first and last name, degree (BA, BS, MA, PhD, PsyD, etc.), and the site at which the presented data was obtained.

Award Consideration: Please indicate if the author is a graduate student, intern, or post-doctoral fellow. The authors of the two top-rated submissions will be awarded a prize of \$100 each, with one of the awards going to the poster that best contributes to the topic of culture and diversity in neuropsychology. If you are a trainee and you submit a poster for presentation, then your attendance at the symposium is **FREE**.

Title and Text: Include a 250 word abstract in the box provided. Please **OMIT** authors from the text box, but include the complete title of the submission. Use 12 point font and single line spacing.

If you wish to submit a poster, please register online (use coupon code “poster”) and submit your completed submission form along with a one-page PDF copy of the poster to Dr. Michael Williams at MWwilliams2@uh.edu. The subject line should state, “**HNS Symposium Research Award.**”

The award will be presented during the October 22nd HNS Symposium. Poster set-up will begin at 8:00 am, and materials for poster display will be provided. Authors should be available to discuss their research with interested parties during parts of registration and breaks.
